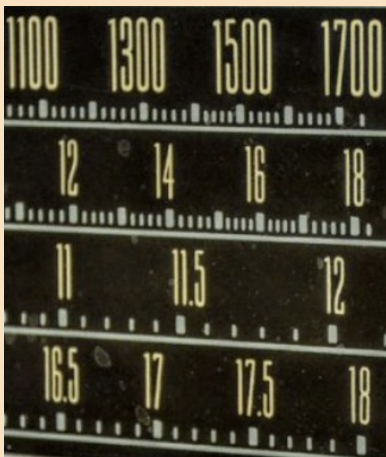

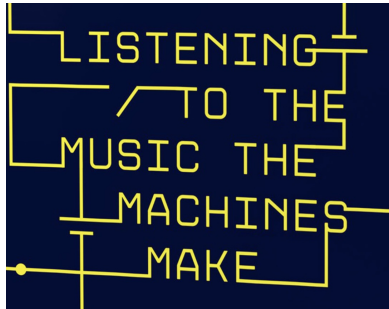
Podcast: Native American Audio Archives

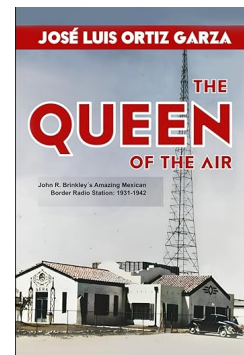
